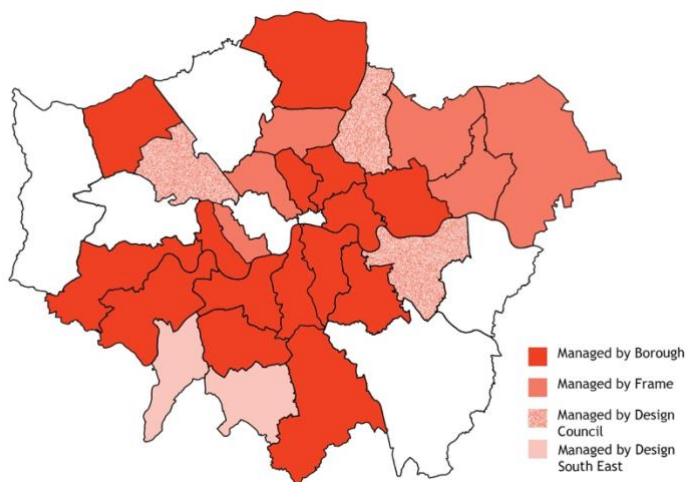
London Quality Review Charter
